He then allowed the score to stand for Redmonds. The chairman Michael Deering said there was nothing in the objection about that goal. After some discussion, the referee's decision was upheld.

May 26, 1892

At the monthly meeting of the club, the chairman, Patrick Leahy, characterized the action of the county board as very unfair in awarding the match to Redmonds. He went on to say the club should refrain from taking any further part in the championship. Mr. John Nagle, vice-chairman, said he gave a detailed account to the county board, as his opinion was Redmonds were prepared to win at all costs, considering the previous contests of their first team against both Aghabullogue and Bride Valley, ended in dispute, with the county board favouring the Redmonds on those occasions also.

The match was a well contested one, and were it not for a few disputes which caused play to be suspended for over a quarter of an hour in one instance, it would have proved very interesting. Why such long delays should occur over comparatively trifling circumstances, seem inexplicable, and it would be well that the referee's decision on matters in dispute should be accepted without the interference of outside parties. Yesterday's match was fixed for one o'clock, but it was half past three when it concluded. The toss for choice of sides was won by Blackrock who played towards the eastern goal, favoured by a strong wind. They commenced well by getting the leather into the Evergreen ground and here a stiff resistance was offered, for a time the Evergreen posts were in danger, but the backs proved equal to the occasion, and offered a grand defence. The play that followed was of even character and each sally of the Blackrock men was repulsed. Blackrock managed to send the leather flying down the field and between the goal posts after a good defence. Before half time was called, Blackrock had scored two additional points, while the Evergreen team still had a clean sheet. Change of sides however brought with it the advantage of the wind and they proceeded to show up better than hitherto. For the first five minutes a really good display of hurling was witnessed and every stroke was carefully watched. The Evergreen men finally succeeded in getting possession, and their forwards playing well together quickly transferred the leather to the Blackrock lines. There the Blackrock backs were on the alert, and the contest was carried on for some minutes outside their posts. Evergreen eventually getting the advantage, which they utilised by sending the ball between the goal posts. Matters now waxed warm, and both sides put forward their best efforts. Blackrock again changed the scene of action, the Evergreen men were put on the defensive and a splendid contest resulted in the goal being saved, but Blackrock managed to add another point. Soon after one

of the Blackrock men, in a tussle for the ball, received a nasty cut over the left eye, and had to be taken to the South Infirmary. Blackrock continued to score a few additional points.
