### **Blackrock National Hurling Club**

The club held their annual meeting on Monday evening, October 15th., for the purpose of electing officers for the ensuing year.

#### October 19, 1888

### **County Convention**

Cork Nationals representitives John O'Riordan and Edward Fitzgerald. Blackrock National Club representitives E.D.Barry and Thomas Nagle. Mr.Edward Fitzgerald was proposed as chairman of the county board by Fr. O'Connor(St.Finbarrs) and seconded by Fr. Buckley(Buttevant). Mr. Eugene Crean was proposed by Mr.J.C.Forde and seconded by Mr.T.O'Riordan.

Mr. Eugene Crean was elected, even though he was not in attendance. Mr.Edward fitzgerald said he supposed that if Mr.Crean were present he would thank his supporters, but he though beaten was not disheartened. From the move that was made about the open voting he was not surprised at the result, but he would be a cowardly man if he did not go to the poll not withstanding. He did not care whether he was elected or not, as he said last year, when he was also defeated, but he would, regardless of what had just happened, keep a close look after the interests of the G.A.A. He allowed himself to be put forward as a protest against the way in which the business of the county was managed last year. If it had been taken up by men who understood it, things would not have been managed as they were last year. He was sorry to say that a great deal of apathy was displayed by the committee last year, in consequence of which outsiders had to come in and carry the championship through. The meeting turned out to be stormy from then on, several attempts were made to elect a number of the clergy, but each time they were not supported.

### November 2, 1888

### County board meeting.

A letter was read from the secretary of the Blackrock club, stating they would take no further part in either the Coachford, Little Island or Cork Park tournaments.

### November 14, 1888

A meeting of the Cork National Hurling Club was held at Drawbridge street last evening, Edward Fitzgerald, president in the chair. Jeremiah O'Riordan, member of committee, was called before the meeting to explain his action in violating the laws of the G.A.A. by attending the last meeting of the club, at which he was selected as delegate to the county convention, he having previously accepted the position of honorary secretary to the Blackrock hurling club. He apologised, and stated he acted in ignorance of the rules. The following resolution was proposed, seconded and carried unanimously, the chairman alone dissenting:- That no action be taken on the circular received from the clubs dissenting from the present county board.

### November 16, 1888

### Cork county board.

The secretary brought under notice to the board a circular emanating from the secretary of the Blackrock National Hurling Club, Mr.Jeremiah O'Riordan, and signed by a few seceding clubs. The circular was placed in his hands through the kindness of one of the city clubs. Its object was to disturb the harmony of the association by taking preliminary steps to

form another county board in opposition to the present legally constituted board. He considered the board should take some stern action in the matter.

The following resolution was unanimously agreed to, That, as the principal trust of our office is to preserve independently the discipline of the G.A.A., we see no course open to us than to suspend the following clubs for wilful violation of the rules, and in conformity with rule 12. The following clubs were expelled from the association, and ceased from henceforward to be members of the G.A.A.; Blackrock, St.Finbarrs, Little Island, Ballygarvan, St.Peter and St.Paul's, Ballyhooly, Emmets.

#### November 23, 1888

A meeting of the temporary committee of the suppressed clubs was held last evening at the League of the Cross Hall, Charlotte Quay, Rev, Fr. O'Connor presiding. Edward Fitzgerald was in attendance. He was elected as hon. Treasurer.

### November 26, 1888

Dear sir, we have no desire to interfere in the present controversy between certain clubs and the Cork county board, but we deem it our duty to contradict a statement which appeared in your issue Wednesday 21st. inst over the signature of Jeremiah O'Riordan, hon. Secretary Blackrock Hurling Club, in which he said that he "did not apologise" at a meeting of the committee of the Cork National Hurling Club, held on the 12th. Inst, for his conduct at a previous meeting. His action on that occasion must be explained to be understood. It was as follows, On Tuesday October 16th., he attended a committee meeting of the Cork National Hurling Club, held for the purpose of electing two delegates to attend the annual county convention to be held the following Thursday. He was elected one of the delegates. The night before October 15th., he attended a meeting of the Blackrock Hurling Club, but he did not mention that fact at our meeting. He was questioned on this point on the day of the convention, but denied that he was that person. We subsequently obtained that his statement was false. So much for his truthfulness! A meeting of the Cork National Hurling Club was held on Monday 12. Inst, to consider a circular received from the dissentient clubs. Mr.O'Riordan attended on invitation to explain his grossly dis-honorable conduct at the previous meeting. A charge of misleading the club was brought against him. He pleaded guilty and humbly apologised for his conduct, giving as his excuse his ignorance of the rules of the G.A.A. He was then called upon to withdraw from the meeting, and he did so with the best grace possible under the circumstances. This statement shows that Mr.O'Riordan is deficient of two necessary qualities in every true Gael. It shows a total disregard for truth, and that he is also in blissful ignorance of the rules of the G.A.A., though he aspires to the secretaryship of the proposed dissentient county board about to be formed. As to the publication of the proceedings at our meeting, we cannot see on what authority Mr.O'Riordan said it distinctly stated that they would not be published, unless that it is "a little flight of imagination" on his part, considering that he was compelled to withdraw from the room half an hour before the proceedings terminated, and that no such undertaking could therefore be given him. As to his remarks about "wire pullers", we treat it with the contempt it deserves, and now leave the public to judge of Mr.O'Riordan's action in this matter. We may state that Mr.O'Riordan was a member of our club, the Cork National Hurling Club, for a very short time only, and never took part in any of its matches.

Park Tournament, as a protest against insults offered to our priests at the late convention by a clique at present ruling the county board, I am yours, Jeremiah O'Riordan

A scratch match was played in Cork Park between Blackrock and St.Finbarrs in the absence of Little Island in the Cork Park tournament.

#### December 5, 1888

### Cork County board meeting.

Mr.Meade, secretary of the Cork National Hurling Club, said, in reference to his club, that it was reported that they passed a resolution condeming the county board. He, as secretary of the club, knew nothing of any meeting called for such a purpose.

#### December 8, 1888

Under the auspices of the New City Board, open to all affiliated clubs, hurling and football will be commenced on St.Stephens Day in Cork Park. A valuable silver cup for hurling and one gold and twenty silver medals for football.

Cups and medals specially supplied by the president and treasurer of the board. Clubs of the O'Brien board in north Cork invited to compete.

#### December 29, 1888

The Central Council has recognised the new city board, which from today on is to be called the Cork Board. The new tournament will begin in January due to extra clubs joining.

May 12, 1889 Cork Park Blackrock 3-12 Greenmount 0-1

The crowd in the Park was immense and Blackrock as might be expected, had matters all their own way.

Greenmount won the toss, and soon worked the ball down to their opponents lines, but Blackrock were quick to response, and the ball travelled up the ground in double sharp time. Greenmount were well to the fore, however, and they returned to the charge with the result that the leather was once more sent speeding towards the Blackrock lines. Some equal play was now put in, when Blackrock charged up, and after one repulse, scored three points in succession. Some mid-ground play followed, when Blackrock once more clustered together near the Greenmount goal, and added four more points to their score, Greenmount not being able to make even a show of a stand against their able opponents. The score at half time was Blackrock leading seven points to nil. The second half opened as inauspiciously for Greenmount as the former, and when Blackrock added three points and a goal to their former total, Greenmount refused to continue, alleging that the goal was not fairly obtained. Eventually they resumed after wasting some time, and for the first time scored a point.

# Final June 16, 1889 Cork Park Blackrock 2-4 Carrigtwohill 1-0

An extremely large concourse of people assembled in the Park on Sunday to witness between Blackrock and Carrigtwohill teams, which was to decide the championship of the district under the sway of the Cork Board. The day was a most favourable one. Rev. W.McCullagh, Blackrock and Rev, P.M.Lynch, Carrigtwohill, were present on the ground, with the teams from their respective districts. Carrigtwohill won the toss and kept their backs to the sun for the first half, during which by far the best play was shown. After the puck out, the Blackrock men worked their way to the Carrigtwohill ground, but the visitors saved their lines, and after a splendid rush up the centre length of the field, scored a goal. Dashing play in the centre ensued, from which a body of Blackrock men emerged with the ball before them, and scored a rather easy goal, thus equalizing the score. Blackrock then attached their opponents stronghold with vigor, and a hot piece of play was witnessed ten yards from the posts. They succeeded several times in getting the leather over, but failed to score up to half time. Within the first three minutes of the second half, Blackrock secured a free puck, and from the position of the ball another goal should have been scored, but they scored a second one immediately afterwards, and seemed likely to still further reap the advantage of the position they were held were it not for the splendid defence play of a few Carrigtwohill backs. These latter then changed the scene of operations, and the Blackrock lines were fiercely invaded. Carrigtwohill, however, sent the ball over outside the point posts, when a little judicious play would have easily secured their scoring, and play was again brought in close proximity to their own citadel. Blackrock got another free, and scored a point from it. During the next ten minutes they played anything but a plucky game, getting the ball inside the side lines frequently and obviously for the purpose of not giving the others a chance of scoring. Cork Examiner report:-Blackrock won choice of sides and played with the sun and breeze behind them. They immediately to cut out the work, and after a bit of unexciting play they scored a point. This they followed up with a second point and a goal, and then things began to warm up. Ballyhea showed the way up the field and went near scoring, but the Corkmen getting on to the leather came along with some of their long over ground strokes, making the Ballyhea men feel anxious for a while. But the latter were not long in showing the stuff they were made of, and after a well sustained defence attacked in their turn, and a grand exchange of play followed all through the field. After ten minutes of this sort of thing, Ballyhea with a united charge beat down a skillful and resolute defence and placed a point to their credit. But the leather was

not left rest, and back to the other end again it travelled. Here in front of the posts it waxed hot, and exciting, and several times luck was against the Cork men, they all but scoring each time. Changing places, the play on both side staking it all round, could scarcely have been better. Misses were occasionally made, but the fast and excited nature of the match made these excusable. The play was very evenly balanced, and so far as this half was concerned it was anyone's game up to the last moment. But though every nerve was strained by the players to do some-thing in the second half, the result was barren, and it closed a blank, leaving the Rockies the winners on the whole play by a goal and two points to one point.

### Round-1 January 13, 1889 Cork Park Blackrock 2-4 Tower Street 0-0

Yesterday the opening tie in the series of tournament matches organized by the new Cork Board, was played off in the Park.

The puck out was given at about half-past three, and some very quick and exciting play took place soon after. The ball was sent rapidly up and down the field, and a Blackrock man scored the first point. The Tower Street team then showed some very skillful playing, and carried the ball quickly up the field, and almost immediately scored an over. Although the Tower Street men were hot favourites for this match as they were county and Munster champions, it soon became evident that they were not equal either in dexterity or strength to their opponents. Just after they had scored an over, they certainly played a very good game, but the Blackrock team soon shot out ahead, and a goal was scored, after the same man obtained an over. Some magnificent play was then witnessed, David Hayes receiving a great ovation for the manner in which he handled the ball. A point was soon afterwards gained by the Blackrock team, and more well contested play took place. Half time was then called, and it was believed the Tower Street men would make some records in the second half. Such was not the case. They certainly played more quickly, and were the recipients of great applause for their splendid pucking, but their opponents were too much for them, and after a quarter of an hour's play they scored a goal. Although a point was added to this before half time was called, and when the game had concluded the Tower Street men were beaten.

A lot of well-balanced play now put in by both teams, Blackrock having whatever advantage was finished by several overs. Several times they tried hard to score, but were again and again repulsed until at the end of fifteen minutes play a hard won point was registered to their credit. Blackrock working well together scored another point. When half time was sounded, Blackrock led two points to nil.

On opening play, St. Finbarrs availed to the full advantage the wind's aid, and brought the leather to their adversary's ground, but their efforts were unavailing. Some splendid play was now exhibited by Blackrock, and after a hard tussle the ball was sent flying over the ground outside the point post. Dashing play now characterized the match, and the leather played over the field in a twinkling, the play and speed on both sides was hard to decide which team was the better. The ball now was over from the sideline, and St. Finbarrs getting settled, swept it down to the Blackrock end line, with the result that a point was scored, which seemed to enthuse the crowd mightily. The Blackrock men now got the ball up the field against the wind, but the St.Finbarrs were not to be denied, and just within half a minute of call of time, the southside men made a goal, at which both the crowd and the team went mad with delight. Inniscarra now got an opening and the ball was swept up the field near the Blackrock goal line. They failed to score however and Blackrock returning the charge they carried the leather against all opposition to the other end of the ground. Twice the ball was sent flying over the end line without result. When again in motion it was brought by Inniscarra to mid-ground and here Blackrock made a good stand, which ended in another goal being placed to their credit. The ball was no sooner in motion than a flying shot by a Blackrock man landed it between the point posts and another point was added a minute later. For the space of five minutes there was some nice even play by both sides, at the end of which Blackrock got well in position and a goal was landed. Up to neutral territory the ball sped and Blackrock made another charge sweeping the leather down to almost between the point posts, but the Inniscarra cúlbaire deftly deflected it outside the scoring grounds. For a minute there was a scrummage close to the goalposts, but eventually Inniscarra relieved the tension of the situation and sent the ball out of danger for a time. From the centre of the field, Blackrock drove the leather down ground and here an Inniscarra man inadvertently struck it over his own end line which allowed a forty yard free to Blackrock. Nothing came of it however. Inniscarra now made a good rally, but they could not get near their opponents goal line, and Blackrock again getting well behind the ball, added two more points in quick succession. At half time they led three goals and four points to nil. On the resumption of hostilities, Blackrock swept the ball up the field and over the end line, but Inniscarra got well

together and charged down the field, the ball however going outside the point posts. The Blackrock men now played even than before and carried the war into their enemy country and twice did they bring the ball over the Inniscarra endline. Inniscarra could not succeed in getting the ball beyond midfield and Blackrock made two more assaults on the goal posts but were repulsed. A third time they rushed the attack and a goal was scored. Immediately John O'Shea of Blackrock was struck over the left temple by an Inniscarra's man hurley and for some time there was great excitement, a serious disturbance being barely avoided. The referee ordered the Inniscarra man off the field, but the Inniscarra team demurred to this unless a substitute was allowed, which the referee refused. As a result, Inniscarra refused to continue and play terminated. The referee did what he was bounded to do and awarded the match to Blackrock.

An interesting fact is that Inniscarra were County Board champions and Blackrock were Cork Board / O'Brien Board champions of 1889.

Cork Examiner report:-One of the biggest crowds ever to attend a match in the park were packed in to watch the county champions of the past two years fight it out for supremacy.

Redmonds won the toss and availed of whatever advantage was to be gained from a slight breeze. After some side line maneuver-ing the Redmonds swept the ball into their opponents territory and attacked the goal, but the repulse was as brilliant as the attack and almost without a pause Blackrock getting well in possession drove the leather up the field and scored a well made goal. The puckout marked mid ground as the arena of conflict and the Redmonds getting busy at swooped down on the Blackrock territory and landed the ball under the crossbar. Superb play characterized the next five minutes work almost every yard of ground being hotly contested, but eventually Blackrock not to be stalled off, got the leather between the point posts. The Blackrock men again worked up from the centre of the field, but their attack on the goal was not made in sufficient force and no score resulted. Up and down the ball was now propelled and to vary the lightening flash pucks the side line was occasionally resorted to by both sides. Finally, Blackrock charged the Redmonds goal, but nothing came of it, and a second, third and fourth attack met with a like result. Half time time was now called with Blackrock leading a goal and a point to a goal.

The second half opened with the Redmonds charging twice in quick succession on their opponents goal, but no score being made. The Redmonds got a free puck owing to a mistake of a Blackrock man in striking the ball over his own end line, but O'Callaghan of Redmonds failed to score. However, they were not discouraged by this fact, and coming again with all guns on deck, they scored a nice point. This made the scoring equal and the excitement of the crowd became intense. It was the Blackrock's men turn now to attack in force, which they did in fine form, but they could not get through the lines of the Redmonds defenders, and the scene of hostilities was speedily transferred to neutral territory. A Redmond's mistake gave Blackrock an opening and from the free puck they scored a point. This was followed by a a second charge on the Redmonds goal. The defence was not alone stubborn, but brilliant and ultimately the Redmonds got the best of the tussle and the leather was sent up the field to the Blackrock goal line. No score resulted. Blackrock replied with the same operation with a like result. Some beautiful play was now witnessed, the leather travelling up and down at express speed and finally Blackrock scored another point. The succeeding minute a goal was credited to them also. Redmonds made a rally to stem the tide of disaster that had set in so strongly against them, but it was to

no avail, and soon after the Blackrock men had placed another point, the referee sounded the final whistle.

No score was affected, though the leather which was periliously near the posts, went over the end line. Blarney still kept their rivals on the defence and it was not long before, breaking through the opposition they scored a point, which was disallowed by the referee. Blackrock now relieved the tension on their goal, and a fine puck brought the ball within measurable distance of their opponents uprights. After which a series of short strokes carried it to the goal minder who manfully prevented a score being made. The attack on the posts continued till a badly directed puck sent the ball over the enclosure altogether. When the game resumed the leather was kept well in Blarney territory and Blackrock narrowly missed a point, the ball going about an inch outside the post. They were unfortunate when they made the next effort to score, for they put the ball well in between the point posts. Blarney men were now kept on alert, but at length they carried the ball into Blackrock territory. It did not remain there for long, however the Blackrock men returned it by dint of splendid play. A most brilliant game was now played for a short time. Siege was laid to the Blarney goal posts, but each successive attack was well repulsed, till perseverance was the reward, and Blackrock placed an additional point to their credit. After the puck, the country team got the leather into their hands and after a few well directed pucks a point was secured. At half time Blackrock led (0-2 to 0-1) When the game was resumed, the Blackrock got the ball in hand, who with commendable celerity procured a point. Some exciting play followed, Blarney came very near scoring, but the ball was returned to the other side of the field. Here some fast play took place and a fierce attack was made on the Blarney posts. A great defence was offered however, and Blarney repulsed Blackrock for the time being. The latter resumed their attack and after a good bit of work obtained a goal amidst great hurling. It was sent into play again, and the Ballyhea men, by means of good pucking, managed to work the ball gradually towards their opponents goal, and drew first blood by cleverly scoring a point amid great excitement. The puck out was splendidly received by a Ballyhea back who took the ball cleverly and sent it in close proximity to the posts, here Gorman got possession and sent it flying

between the goal posts. Blackrock now closed together, and by means of of dexterous play, changed the scene of action, but the leather was sent again into midfield, and from this over the Blackrock end lines. The puck out was followed by some smart play, both sides working admiringly, the play was entirely in midfield, and each stroke excited the great enthusiasm, the leather eventually going outside the side lines. Some loose play followed which was mainly confined to the side lines. Eventually Ballyhea succeeded in carrying the ball to the Blackrock territory, and after a good defence by Blackrock they sent the ball over the endline. The puck out was well followed up by Blackrock and by means of some clever scouting, the leather was carried into the Ballyhea ground, and after a stiff tussle the Blackrock men put up a point. Soon the ball was sent into play again. Blackrock cried a foul and a free puck was awarded, which would undoubtedly have led to a goal were it not for the fine defence of the Ballyhea cúlbaire, who sent the leather into play with a splendid stroke. At half time Ballyhea led a goal and a point to a point.

Sides quickly changed, and Blackrock succeeded in continuing the play for several minutes to their opponents ground, and were dangerously near scoring. The play again assumed an even character, and the exhibition on both sides was admirable. At one period a Blackrock man sent the leather into midfield from the side line where it was taken by another player, who went very near scoring. Following this an exciting tussle took place in the Ballyhea ground which resulted in the ball going over the end line. Soon after Blackrock were awarded a free puck which they succeeded in cleverly converting into a point. Blackrock now played in splendid form and frequently stormed their opponents posts, the assaults being well defended by their opponents. During one of these attacks the Blackrock men claimed a free puck on the ground that the ball was hit over the Ballyhea end line by one of their team. This was disputed by the Ballyhea team, but the referee gave the decision in favour of Blackrock, and play was resumed on the forty yards puck, which was well defended. The subsequent play was confined mainly to the side lines in the Ballyhea ground, and the monotony was broken by an exciting skirmish in midfield, the outcome of which was that the Blackrock men sent the ball over the endlines. The ball was quickly in play again in the vicinity of the Ballyhea ground, where it was taken of James Delea who passed to John O'Leary by whom it was sent through for a goal. Shortly after, the referee sounded the final whistle.

Blackrock became the first club to win the double in county championships when their senior and second teams each won their respective championships. It was also the first three in a row.

The constabulary were out in force ready for a riot which was what they expected to happen. As it turned out there was not a single incident, as all were enthralled with the match.

The first half was all that was expected from these great rivals as the leather spun from end to end with both teams intent on skill and manly persuit. Redmonds were first to score, but very quickly Blackrock equalized and then led to half time by four points to two. As the second half progressed the crowd following every stroke began to encroach onto the playing area several times. Despite that both teams continued to display great skills with overhead striking prominent. Midway through the second half Redmonds scored the only goal of the game. A tiring Blackrock failed to score in the second half as Redmonds ran out winners. Cork Examiner report:-The record of the Blackrock hurling club is a record of victories, which in number and brilliance surpass the victories of any other club in the country. Yet another victory was recorded yesterday, when in the final match of Cork County Championship, the old guard of the Irish hurling army inflicted a heavy defeat on Aghada. Weather was perfect and the ground in splendid order, while about eight thousand enthusiastic but orderly spectators watched the game. That Blackrock would win was the general belief, but that they would win by such a large score as they did was scarcely anticipated, except perhaps by a few very ardent supporters. The members of the Blackrock team are a very levelheaded and cool body of men, who though holding almost an unbeaten record, are never over confident, or think any opponents unworthy of respect. This good quality has had much to say to the great achievements of the champions. Yesterday every man played in excellent form, even when victory was assured, and the combination of the team was as fine ever. Aghada team was a good team, and in their class would be hard to beat, but they were altogether outclassed yesterday. At no part of the game did they make any prolonged stand against the victors, and the fact that they were unable to score even one point tells its own tale. Three or four times they had chances of scoring, but want of accuracy told against them. From its one-sided character the game does not lend itself to detailed description, which would only be monotonous repetition of goals and points scored by Blackrock. During the first half the game never left the Aghada ground. Blackrock with the wind to their backs, started with a very hot attack, and though the pace slowed down afterwards their superiority was always manifest and at half time led two goals and five points to nil.

The second half was much the same as the first, except that Aghada Three or four times took the ball down to the Blackrock posts by long puck outs, but were unable to make any use of the advantage. The attendance however was of fairly large proportions. Owing to the sodden condition of the field, the teams fought out at considerable disadvantage to both sides the men slipping on the grass on several occasions. The Blackrock veterens again asserted their superiority and therefore occupy the proud

position of being the premier county team.

Carrigtwohill won the toss and played towards the Blackrock end. When the ball was out for a minute or two in motion, it was returned to the Carrig ground, where after a brief tussle, it was sent over the end line. On the leather being put into play was taken to the off side of the field. Here it stood for a short spell, and Blackrock coming on sent the ball outside the posts. Some few minutes after, Carrig secured the first point. Numerous interchanges ensued, when the leather found itself again in the Blackrock territory and a second minor resulted. At his stage the rain had become lighter and Blackrock took advantage. With a brilliant rush forced their way through their opponents back division scoring a point, followed by a goal. After the puck out, Carrig became more active and things looked dangerous for a time. Neutral ground was the scene of operations, and a number of long pucks placed the Blackrock stronghold in jeopardy. Another point was secured by Carrigtwohill. From this point to the end of the first half, it was all Blackrock who led two goals and two points to three points at half time.

Entering on the second half, side line play of an uninteresting character was witnessed. A long delay was occasioned by the leather being sent over the enclosure. On the ball being thrown in again, Blackrock got away and pressed their opponents for a lengthened period, but failed to score. Here a Blackrock man had to retire injured. Play resumed and a white flag was raised for Blackrock. From there to the expiration of full time, Blackrock were practically masters of the situation.
