A hard worker who was well able to look after his zone on the pitch but once possession was assured, the ball was sent on its way with accuaracy and skill with as sweet a strike as any of his peers.

Dermot is yet another serial winner from The Rockies class of the 1970s. As impressive a stash as medals as you are likely to see and the personal recognition of winning three All-Stars prove that you are in the presence of hurling royalty with Dermot MacCurtain.

Dermot joined The Rockies from
Delaneys at the age of 17 and as a minor
hurler achieved a remarkable success by
winning a schools' hurling and football
All-Ireland as well as an Inter County
Minor Hurling and Football All-Ireland in
the same year. U21 success with Cork
would follow and in 1975 Dermot won
the first of four counties with The
Rockies. A vital part of this glorious
period in the club, Dermot was
instrumental in winning the All-Ireland
twice with the club.

All-Ireland success with Cork came in '77, '78, '84 and '86. All Star Awards came in 1979, 1980 and 1984. Dermot's name is recognised across the country and was renowned for doggedly winning possession via the block, hook or whatever means necessary as well as having the skill to make things happen.
